Abstract

The study aimed to identify the academic procrastination level of students at A'Sharqiyah University. A random sample of 402 students at A'Sharqiyah University was chosen. The researchers used the descriptive survey approach to answer the research questions. The academic procrastination scale was prepared through reviewing a number of scales that measured academic procrastination and relevant variables. The study was applied in the first semester of the academic year 2022 – 2023. The findings showed that the phenomenon of academic procrastination is spreading among the students at

A'Sharqiyah University to a medium level which is different from the hypothetical level of the phenomenon in society with a statistical significance lower than 0.05. The level of the spread of this phenomenon among the students at Al'Sharqiyah University did not differ as per gender, college or study year, but it differed according to cumulative average or GPA. The findings showed that average students whose GPAs ranged between 2.00 and 3.00 were most of the students who procrastinated completing their academic tasks compared to the students whose GPAs were higher than 3.00. The study recommended making more effort to help students organize their time, raise their learning motivation and train them in academic self-efficacy.
